For the first Passover feast, God requested the Israelites to use a lamb for a household. And the lamb is to be without blemish. And because the Bridegroom is without blemish His bride must of necessity be without blemish too.

The flesh of the Lamb stands for body of Christ which is the bread of life, while the fire it is roasted with stands for the Holy Spirit.

No one can truly be neutral as far as Christ or Christian is concerned. The man who will not submit to Christ has necessarily rejected Him

1. THE ANOINTING ATTRACTS BLESSING TO THE ANOINTED

One of the conditions for receiving Divine visitors is hospitality. Also, those who receive Divine visitors always receive miracles, not death. Just as the anointed grows physically, so also can the anointing grow in intensity. Moreover, the anointing brings to the anointed blessings because of the presence of the Holy Spirit.

Whenever the enemy tries to cheat the anointed, the enemy ends up being the cheated. This is because anointing goes hand in hand with fire, our God being himself a consuming Fire. The fire purifies the anointed as it burns the planting of the enemy.
